


### SYNCing to Empower Black Women in HIV Prevention: Health Departments and HBCUs

This session is intended to provide a comprehensive overview of the current landscape of HIV prevention for Black women—from both a Health Department and HBCU perspective, emphasizing the need for culturally competent, multimodal strategies that are feasible and scalable. Participants will gain insight into practical approaches for reducing HIV and STI risk among one of the most vulnerable populations in the U.S.

Health Department staff will highlight the benefits of engaging with the community in several ways, including, the engagement of community based organizations in a Black women's microgrant program aimed at supporting existing programs to increase their capacity to deliver health and wellness services to cisgender Black women in the District of Columbia and staff from an HBCU will share details of programming recently launched to empower Black women by pairing educational and arts initiatives through strategic partnerships with other Universities and non-profit organizations dedicated to HIV prevention.

## Navigating Healthy Aging: Innovation, Challenges, and Equitable Health Solutions

This institute will open with an overview of HealthHIV's Third Annual State of Aging with HIV™ National Survey. ## Unveiling HIV: Challenging Assumptions on Molecular Surveillance and Criminalization

Thirty states in the U.S. criminalize people living with HIV (PLHIV), targeting them through specific laws or enhanced penalties on the basis of their health status. Research shows that these laws are disproportionately used to prosecute Black people, who are already disproportionately targeted by other forms of criminalization and surveillance. There exists a long history of the criminalization of LGBTQ and Non-Binary folks on the basis of their sexualities and gender identities as well. The techniques used to identify and target people for surveillance and criminalization have advanced at the speed of technological progress, hurried along through the proliferation of databases (public and private), social media, and algorithms.

It is against this backdrop that the CDC promotes Molecular HIV Surveillance (MHS), a program through which a national database of personal health data is collected without PLHIV's knowledge or consent. PLHIV and advocates have challenged MHS both as a violation of their rights to control the use of their medical information as well as a program that puts their data (and freedom) at risk. Many states have limited protections for data collected as a part of public health surveillance, and in fact some states encourage health departments to cooperate with law enforcement. This cooperation between local health departments and law enforcement erodes the relationships between medical providers and patients and reinforces the long-standing medical mistrust from marginalized communities.

These are the complex and interrelated issues that the attendees of this institute will have the opportunity to learn about and unpack. Experts will ground attendees in an understanding of HIV criminalization as well as the efforts that attendees can join for modernizing HIV criminalization laws and eradicating HIV related stigma. Attendees will also have the opportunity to learn more about MHS and why PLHIV and advocates are so concerned with a program whose ostensible purpose is the promotion of public health. Finally, panelists will educate attendees on the interrelationship between different forms of surveillance, focusing on different ways in which reproductive autonomy is targeted as a case study. Through facilitated panel discussions and other activities attendees will have the opportunity to learn from PLHIV and advocates about these important issues and challenge their assumptions and re-evaluate who is the "public" when we discuss public health.

**Mobilizing Towards PrEP Access For All**

Hosted by PrEP4All, this Institute will focus on several ways that participants can immediately engage in the movement for equitable PrEP access.

Since 2018, PrEP4All has led the charge for a federally-funded National PrEP Program for un- and underinsured individuals, leading to the Biden Administration calling for \$9.8 billion over ten years for the “PrEP For All To End The HIV Epidemic” initiative in the White House FY2023 budget request. PrEP4All and our partners have since mobilized with legislators, federal stakeholders, and community members to push Congress to approve funding for a National PrEP Program. We are also leaders in the fight to ensure access for insured individuals, convening urgent community town halls in response to the threats posed by *Braidwood v. Becerra*.

Join PrEP4All for an interactive institute that will focus on uplifting the voices of PrEP users, providers, and community members to address policy and cost barriers that impact PrEP access for uninsured and underinsured individuals, as well as looming legal threats impacting cost and access for insured individuals.




## FOCUS on Health Equity: A National Model for HIV/HCV/STI Screening and Linkage to Care in Clinical and Community Settings

The FOCUS Program is an initiative of the Government Affairs team at Gilead Sciences Inc. that ensures all eligible individuals have access to screening and linkage to care for HIV, HCV, HBV, and linkage to HIV comprehensive prevention services. The FOCUS program partners with healthcare and community-based organizations across the United States, Spain, and Portugal, to implement and share best practices following guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The importance of routine, opt-out screening and linkage to care cannot be overstated – according to the CDC, 7 in 10 people with HIV saw a healthcare provider in the 12 months prior to diagnosis and failed to be diagnosed. With over 400 community and clinical partners (current and graduated), the FOCUS program has become the largest blood-borne virus screening and linkage to care program in the nation and has changed how communities view and do blood-borne virus screening. Drawing from experiences across the United States with the FOCUS program, our expert panel will discuss how the FOCUS approach has helped to reduce stigma, increase health equity, and bring to scale best practices honed through implementation science.






